# The 19th Cambridge International Symposium on Economic Crime The Hiding of Wealth

It is only by confronting these issues from a multidisciplinary and truly international perspective that the values we all seek to maintain can be properly protected.

The Symposium provides, through the main programme and extensive series of workshops, a unique blend of formal presentation, structured analysis and discussion, which is complemented by unrivalled opportunities for networking. The structure of the programme, refined over nineteen years of experience within an academic institution of over 500 years standing, and drawing on the advice and support of a world wide consortium of universities, is able to address the many and varied issues, in a manner which offers real and practical assistance to those who have to look after other peoples' money or advise and protect those who do. The outstanding support that the organising institutions have received, over the years, from around the world is a testament to the relevance and significance of the Symposium.
